

## Well Completion Record Filing Requirements

SB 165 has added new requirements to be reported when filling out the Well Completion Record (Form 8). In addition to the items that were formerly required, it is now mandatory to report additional information with regard to well stimulation. To meet these requirements, the redesigned Form 8 has added the following:

- 1) In Box 34 supply the name of the company that fracked the well;
- 2) In Box 35 indicate how the recovered frac fluid is contained. Check boxes have been added for both swabbed fluid and flowback fluid containment. Indicate whether containment is in a pit or frac tank.  
In Box 35 indicate the date the well was fracked.

In the case of multi-stage treatments, attach additional sheets as necessary.

Producers are now required to file copies of the following frac company documents:

- 1) A job summary sheet showing the volumes, types of fluid, proppant, rates and pressures of the frac job;
- 2) An invoice detailing the frac job. Charges on the invoice may be redacted if desired;
- 3) The pressure/rate graph from the frac job.

The well completion record should be filed in duplicate along with one copy of each geophysical wireline log that was run within sixty (60) days of drilling the well to total depth. A well completion record and log is required even if the well is determined to be a dry hole and is plugged upon that determination

If a well is not completed for production within the designated filing time, a supplemental well completion record that includes all required information must be filed within sixty days after the well is completed for production.

Logs may be kept confidential for up to six months from the date the well was logged or such additional time as may be granted by the chief.

A well completion record is also required for any well that is reopened, deepened, plugged back or reworked. Any cased hole (perf) log made should be filed with the well completion record..

If the well was not drilled, check the box in the upper right corner on Form 8 and return it to the Division within thirty days after expiration of the permit.
